Extension Activities

BISW Projects

The Department of Social Work has been implementing various Reach Out community Service Projects from 1979. It bloomed into "**Bosco Institute of Social Work**" for the practice dimension of the holistic Social Work education we offer in our department. The reach - out projects have been under taken studying the needs, problems and intervention strategies appropriate to the time and context of Tirupattur rural areas.

Mahalir Thittam

Mahalir Thittam is a Tamil Nadu Women's Development project. It lays emphasis on qualitative and socio economic development of women. The ultimate objective of this project is the empowerment of women in rural Tamil Nadu. The empowerment of women would lead to benefit at two levels: 1) Direct benefits to the individual women and women's Group.2) Development benefits for families and community as a whole.

1. Social development
2. Economic Development
3. Capacity building of women

CRECHE

Since 1990 two day- care centers (Creches) for per-school children are run by the institute in two village by name Sagayanagar and Sivarajpet. A total of 60 Children (30 per center) benefit by the programme. This is sponsored by the Tamil Nadu Social Welfare Board.

Family Counseling Centre (FCC)

FCC was started in 1990 and has been serving effectively for over 15 years. It is a great help for the rural families in problems. The programme is sponsored by State Social Welfare Board. The center gives counselling services to the rural family members for various problems and issues.

DEEDS (Department of Extension Education Service and Research) is one of Sacred Heart College department that offers and coordinates various awareness and student involvement programmes and developmental and social research activities in Tirupattur region.

Credit Linkages

Rs. 4,16,25,000.00 credit linked various category of people such as self help group members, petty traders, entrepreneurs, etc., with the support of Vellore Central Cooperative Bank, Punjab National Bank, Indian Bank, Canara Bank, Pallavan Bank, and Tirupattur SBI etc., More than 6500 people were benefited by this activity.

Trainings

The following Trainings were conducted during the year 2011-2012 Self Help Group Management Training (4), A&R (Leadership) Training (4), Entrepreneur Skill Development Training (4), Management Development Training (1), Rural Entrepreneur Development Training (1), Skill Training (8) such as Waste Leather Products, Handicraft Training, Coir mat Training, Paper cup product, arecanut products, coir yarn, Tailoring Training for (2), PLF office bearers management training (10), Staff Development Training (2), etc., were executed during the year of 2011-2012. More than 1010 candidates benefited from the above trainings. Supported by Tamil Nadu Women Development Corporation, Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, NABARD, Municipal Corporations and Tamil Nadu Voluntary Resource Centre.

Finance Inclusion Project

This project was launched in September 2012. It was sponsored by coramandal agency. This project included 9 panchayat villages were to open smart card for all the people in the 9 villages. So far 4500 individuals accounts have been opened and smart card will be provided soon. This is new project introduced by the Government in order to help the people who are getting old age pension and other benefits through Government schemes.
