Extension Activities

DBSARC

Don Bosco Social Action and Research Centre (DBSARC) - a forum that voices out the rights of the marginalized and acts as a platform for genuine dialogue has organized various programmes for motivating youth to become active agents of social change.

1. CRECHE

Sponsored by Central Social Welfare Board is effectively functioning in 2 centres in the campus with two Teachers, two Child care helpers and 80 children. Besides this the parents have also benefitted through monthly meetings, medical camps and other child care orientations.

2. Drop Out Prevention Centers

Drop out prevention centers function in 3 active localities to address the misfortunes of children, dropping their education due to various reasons. The centres are operated at:

1. D.B.Centre
2. Annandapatti
3. Idaya nager

3. Evening Tuition Centers

Evening Tuition Centres are conducted to offer additional coaching to the students. They also serve to assist the poorest of these children with note books and school stationery, dress, Christmas gifts, school fees for some of them

etc. Materials for Indoor recreation and out-door Games are provided. About 6 staff members are involved in this venture.

D.B. Centre directly caters to 145 poor children and the number of indirect beneficiaries amount to 290 parents who come for orientation and empowerment programmes twice a year.

4. Family Counselling Centre

Family Counselling continues to be a place where several men and women come to get counselling. It is supported by Central Social Welfare Board / State Social Welfare Board. It is also extended to women and children who are prone to exploitation by the members of the society at large. Distressed women are provided services like crisis intervention, investigation in dowry death cases, counselling in cases of marital, family maladjustment, efforts for reconciliation in cases of separation, out of court settlement in marital cases or referral services like short stay, legal aid, police assistance etc, by trained counsellors and social workers.

Mr. Aruldoss M.A., (Economics), M.A., (Sociology) and Mrs. Tharageswari M.A., Sociology, M.Sc., Psychology are now engaged in this work and this year alone the centre has catered to about 1000 people.

5. Tailoring

Women Economic Empowerment through Tailoring is a programme where young women are trained to earn their livelihood. They are also prepared for Government Exams in Tailoring. Ms. Violet Mary conducts the tailoring classes. So far 83 trainees and 415 indirect beneficiaries have profited through this programme this year.

6. Self-Help Groups

Self-Help Groups functioning in the campus provide loans for education of children, medical camps, women empowerment programmes and trainings towards holistic health; Income generation activities are offered to the members and their families. This programme is supported by NABFIN and has provided loans to 345 groups so far. Total amount of loan dispersed to 4140 members is 14.7 crores with funds from Nabard Financial Services Ltd and the total number of beneficiaries are 20,700.

7. Solid and Liquid Resource Management (SLRM)

123 college students (UG & PG) have been trained in Solid waste management in an effort to reduce the use of water and other resources and also to promote eco friendliness in the campus.

8. DEEDS (Department of Extension Education and Dedicated Services)

DEEDS is conducted in the campus with the motto "Transferring the Technology-Core Competency to the neighbourhood rural poor"

- ❖ 18 Undergraduate Departments of Shift - I & II every year undertake this programme and share their core competency with the neighbourhood.
- ❖ About 1017 second year undergraduate students from both the Shifts actively contributed their part for the successful conduct of this programme.

- ❖ About 18 villages were visited by our students under DEEDS programme.

Green Auditing

To promote eco-friendliness among the stake-holders, Green Auditing has been introduced from this academic year. As a part of this initiative the following programmes were organized.

- ❖ A one day state level work shop was conducted in collaboration with the Department of Environmental Science of Bishop Heber College, Trichy.
- ❖ Water analysis was carried out in and around Tirupattur town to ascertain the water quality. Students enthusiastically participated in this venture.
