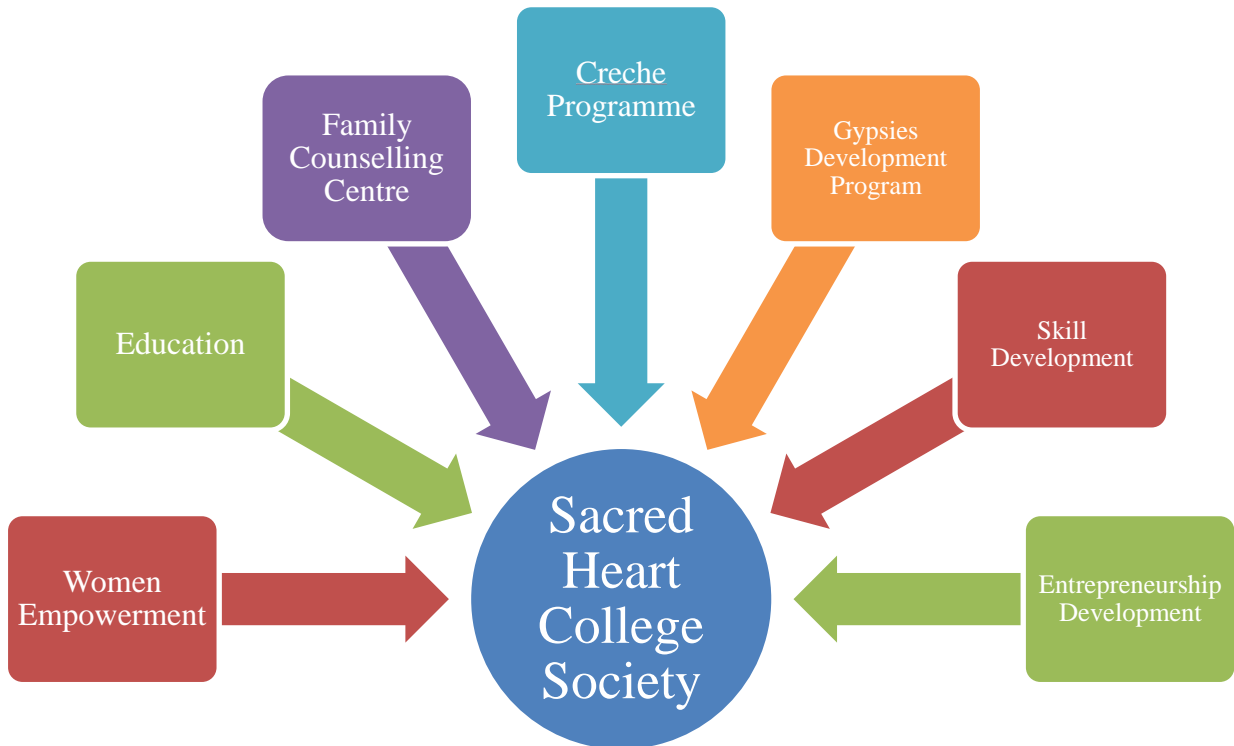

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

Self Help Groups

The women empowerment programme of The Sacred Heart College Society focuses on bringing women together for creating a common platform of mutual trust and support. The Self Help Group program is an extension of the Women's Empowerment program under which, the women save up small amounts every month in SHGs (Self Help Groups). They borrow small loans from their SHGs which help overcome their dependency on traditional money lenders for petty credit needs. The SHG also allows women to set up small business for earning some cash. Besides the financial autonomy, the SHG extends a platform for these women to discuss social issues. It strengthens their solidarity, builds their confidence and allows them a space to unload and deliberate solutions. Presently we run this program in partnership with NABFINS

(NABARD Financial Services Pvt. Ltd) and Indian Bank. Our SHG's have been engaged in enterprises like Coir Yarn Making, Coir Mat, Small Millets Value Additions, Masala Powder Making, Milk Value Additions, Vermicomposting and Leaf Plate Making etc.

Economic Assistance to SHGs

Self Help Group is a visible organized setup to disburse microcredit to the rural women and encourage them in entrepreneurial activities. SHGs and micro-credit are the solutions to speed up the socio-economic development of poor women.

The Sacred Heart College Society has been working as a catalyst in promoting and linking more and more SHGs to the banking system. We have been associated with NABFINS Ltd., for credit linkage of the SHGs. This would be utilized for scaling up the SHG-linkage programme and supporting other microcredit initiatives. Special emphasis is provided for building the capacities of the poor with particular emphasis on vulnerable sections. The economic assistance provided by NABFINS, TAHDCO and VCCB with regard to microcredit presented in Table reveals that 190 SHGs as on 01.04.2021 credit linked. The cumulative credit disbursed by them is Rs. 09.87 crores as on 31.03.2022

TAHDCO Economic Assistance Loan

TAHDCO has implemented many development programme / scheme for financial assistance of the economic development of Scheduled Caste from Special Central Assistance. The Self Help Groups are provided with economic assistance to start income generating activities in their own villages. Under Economic Assistance scheme the Self help groups are eligible to get one time assistance for economic activity and 50% of the project cost or Rs.2.50 lakhs whichever is lower will be given subsidy. The subsidy will be a Front End Subsidy for economic assistance. We have facilitated 22 SHGs to avail EA loan of Rs. 11,00,0000.

FAMILY COUNSELING CENTRE (FCC)

Family Counselling Centre is established in 1991 by Don Bosco Institute of Social Work. It is functioning with the collaboration of Central Social Welfare Board (CSWB), New Delhi. It provides counselling, referral and rehabilitative services to men, women, and children who are affected by work related issues, victims of family maladjustments, atrocities, social ostracism and also provide crisis intervention and trauma counselling in case of disasters. On an average, every year, the centre intervenes 450 families to have better and fruitful family life. Recently, a team from TISS (Tata Institute of Social Sciences) came to centre as part of quality assessment on behalf of the CSWB. It appreciated the centre for its contribution to the society for more than 25 years. The inspection team ranked the family counselling centre as No.1 among all other centres in Tamil Nadu.

The centre has qualified and experienced trainers and counsellors. The centre focuses on the betterment of newly married couples, aged, adolescences and special children. The centre has

expertise in dealing with the areas of family maladjustments, extra-marital affairs, Alcoholism, marital problems, psychological problems, work place related problems, personality differences, and rehabilitation. Based on its outcome based interventions, the Tamil Nadu State Government has declared the centre as State Service Provider and the counsellors have been declared as protection officers under the Domestic Violence Act, 2005.

He was telling that, she was not cooperative and engaged in mobile calls with someone. The counsellor gave counselling to the both individually and trying to get reunion to the family. They had session with the inspector and made them to understand each other. At present they are living together happily.
- Mr. S was unemployed due to lock down and couldn't get any work; the counsellor referred a work as a cook in nearby NGO Udhavum Ullangal. She thanked the counsellor, at present she is on cloud nine and the NGO supported for her children's education.

CHILD DEVELOPMENT

CRECHE PROGRAMME

The Sacred Heart College Society organizing two crèche centres with funded by Central Social Welfare Board, Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India, New Delhi under the scheme of Rajiv Gandhi National Creche Scheme from 1986. The crèche centres

were located in Sivrajpet and Sagaya Nagar, Tirupattur Block of Vellore District. In each centre more than 40 under privileged children, who were not able to get mother care and protection in the age of <5 age were admitted. So, totally 90 children benefited on this programme. Supplementary nutrition food was given to the children for 25 days in a month. Emergency medicines were also given to the children. Play materials and educational aid were provided to the crèche children. For safe cooking gas cylinder with cooking stove and vessels were provided to the both centres.

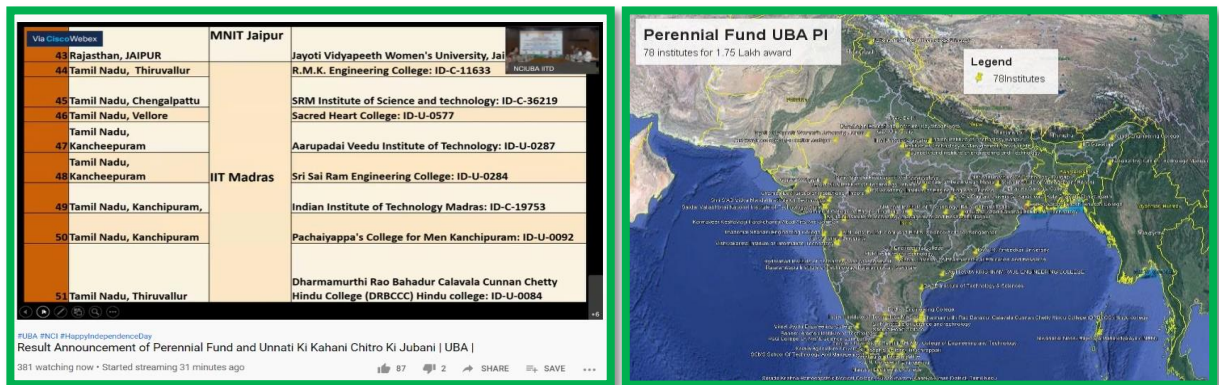

ACTIVITIES UNDER UNNAT BHARAT ABHIYAN (UBA)

The Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) has launched Unnat Bharat Abhiyan with an aim to connect institutions of higher education with local communities to address the development challenges through appropriate technologies. We have been adopted five panchayats namely A.K.Mottur, Kasinayakanpatti, Kethandapatti, Mookanur and Periyagaram in consultation with the District Collector and use their knowledge base to find solutions for the issues of basic amenities & livelihood opportunities faced by the rural communities and thereby help in bringing about a qualitative change in the economic change in the economic and living standards of the people.

We have completed baseline survey in the adopted villages with support of MSW students and prepared Gram Panchayat Development Plan (GPDP) to solve the village level problems. The UBA Cell was actively involving under the abled guidance and support of our Principal Dr. D. Maria Antony Raj and UBA Cell Coordinator Fr. S. Henry Daniel Ambrose and assisted by P. Nicola Prakash, Project Officer.

We have submitted proposal for additional funding under Perennial Assistance scheme and out



of 473 proposals across the India and 78 institutions have been selected under this scheme and we are one among them.

The Sacred Heart College (Autonomous) has been awarded **Rs.1, 75,000** under the **UNNAT BHARAT ABHIYAN (UBA) Perennial Assistance Scheme** by Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) and facilitated by IIT Delhi on the auspicious occasion of Independence Day celebrations on **15th August 2020** for implementing village development activities effectively in the adopted Villages.

DEEN DAYAL UPADHYAYA GRAMEEN KAUSHALYA YOJANA (DDU-GKY): SKILL TRAINING

DDU-GKY is uniquely focused on rural youth between the ages of 18 and 35 years from poor families. As a part of the Skill India campaign, it plays an instrumental role in supporting the social and economic programs of the government like the Make In India, Digital India, Smart Cities and Start-Up India, Stand-Up India campaigns. The Sacred Heart College Society has received sanction to train 520 unemployed rural youth from Vellore, Tiruvannamalai, Krishnagiri and Dharmapuri Districts from the Tamil Nadu State Rural Livelihood Mission (TNSRLM), Govt. of Tamil Nadu.

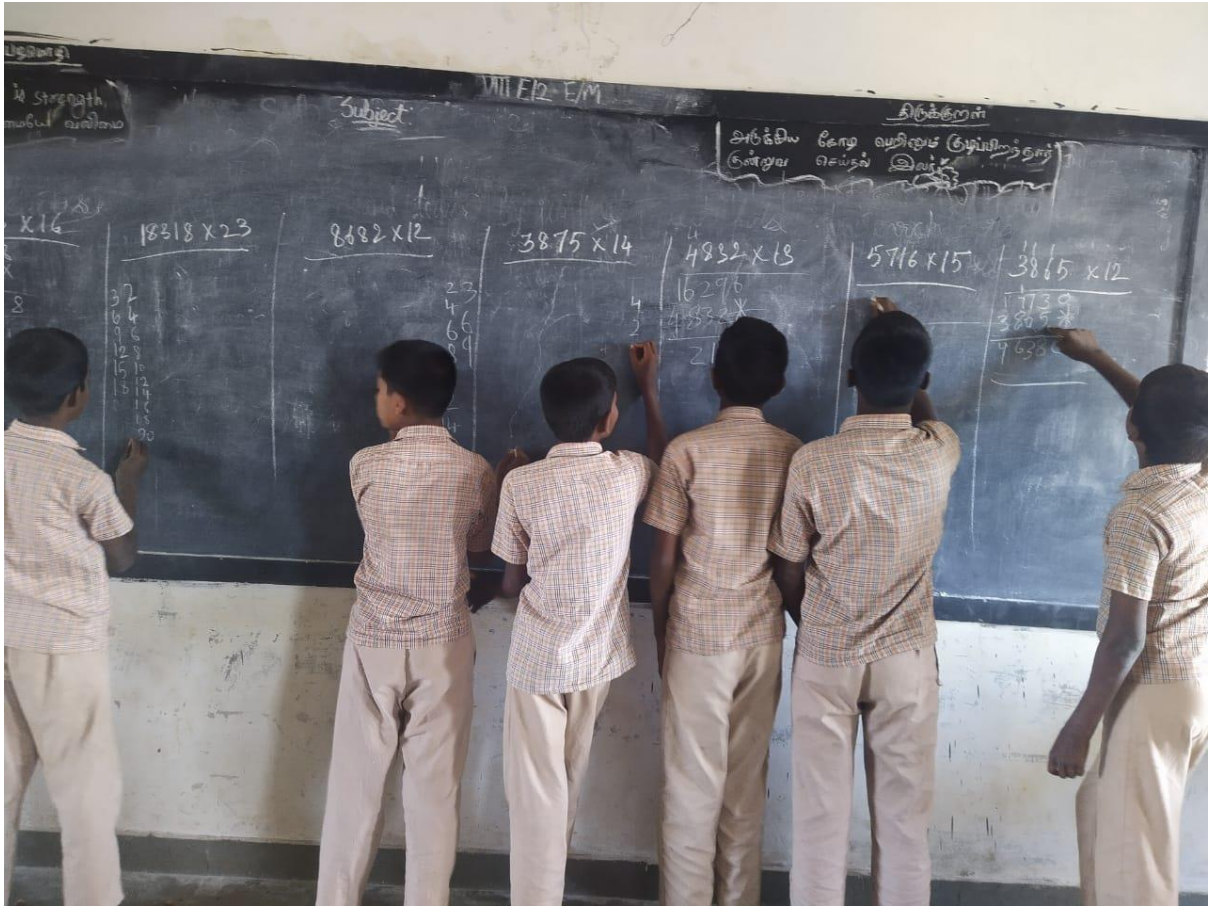

Sacred Heart College has always been in the lookout to serve the most needy of the neighborhood and society through the Department of Extension Education and Services (DEEDS), headed by Fr.S.Henry Daniel Ambrose SDB, from the Dept. of Social Work. DEEDS joins hands with various Government and Non-Governmental and Industries to cater to the urgent needs of most disadvantaged sections of the society. From October 2021 DEEDS reaches out to more than 5600 children in 20 Government Schools in and around Hosur supported by the CSR funds of Schaeffler India Limited, Hosur, through the Project titled “Learning Outcome Improvement Project”. Popularly called “School to Career (S2C) Project”, it aims to improve the quality of learning in the Education offered. The Project has the following 4 Objectives:

1. To inculcate the learning interest among the students at primary level.
2. To assess the learning gap and to achieve Learning Improvement.
3. To bring up the Slow Learners at par with the other students through Remedial Education.
4. To identify and support the Bright Students from 9th Std. to 12th Std. for their better academic excellence and Career Progress.

The Project has 20 Resource Persons and 3 Mentors. We truly believe that this Project will enable children to progress in their Career through its Scholastic and Co-Scholastic Interventions. Schaeffler India Limited, the funding partner has committed to over INR 3 crores in the next 3 years and offers unconditional support in the Project Progress.
